All national and regional officers must receive an invitation to all public JJ events (Fundraiser, Jack and Jill Day, Black Family Day, any event to which guests are invited)

If your budget cannot support paying for the National Officers or Regional Director, you must clearly mark the invitation as F.Y.I. (For Your Information)

An FYI Invitation is a courtesy notification only

A Complimentary Invitation" must be marked as "Complimentary"

* This indicates that the chapter or entity hosting the event will assume all expenses

Complimentary invitations may be made via telephone by Chapter President, and then followed up in the form of a letter on chapter stationary. The letter should be inserted with a general invitation for the event so all parties involved will have the pertinent information.

* Complimentary includes cost of event, Transportation and Hotel Accommodations
